# A Special Musical Gathering Commemorating the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Liberation of Auschwitz

It will be held in the City of Hannover at the beautiful Villa Seligmann, (called the House of Jewish music). ECA is organising and presenting this Convention in partnership with the **Jewish**Community of Hannover and the Association of Jewish Communities for Lower Saxony

Sessions will highlight the Progress of Synagogue music in the last 75 years and where it might go in the future

Cantor Asher Hainowitz of Jerusalem will be a tutor and there will be presentations by other international known experts and practitioners, including **Professor Mark Kligman** of Los Angeles and Cantor **Beny Maissner** of Toronto, (whose family came from Hannover and whose uncle **Israel Alter**, was chief cantor there from 1925-1935). There will also be opportunities for **delegates to present short sessions** and to sing in the open mic and concerts.

# The 'Night' Concert

We are privileged to be in Hannover on Monday night 27 January, when **The 'Night' Concert** will be presented. This is an oratorio, based on the Holocaust testimony book 'Night' by Elie Wiesel. It will feature the Kaliningrad Symphony Orchestra and the Vilnius State Choir as well as Moscow and Hannover Jewish choirs and Cantor Daniel Mutlu of New York as soloist. It was composed by esteemed cantor and composer Leib Glantz and arranged and orchestrated by Joseph Ness (USA).

# Villa Seligmann

This beautiful house, where our 13<sup>th</sup> European Cantors Convention will be hosted, used to belong to a tyre magnate before WW2. It is now designated a 'House of Jewish music'. Its upper floor houses the offices of the European Centre for Jewish music (EZJM) which is part of Hannover's University of Music Theatre and Dance. Its lower floors house synagogue organs saved from ruins in Germany and Hungary.

# Magnified and Sanctified 2 – the International Conference

Alex Klein and Geraldine Auerbach were visiting Hannover to attend the Second International Conference on the music of Jewish Prayer (9-12 September 2019) co-organised by ECA Academic Wing with the European Centre for Jewish Music (EZJM) at the Hannover University of Music Theatre and Dance. It was a very satisfying, friendly and enjoyable event, charmingly and efficiently hosted by Professor Dr Sarah Ross and researchers Martha Stellmacher and Miranda Crowdus of EZJM. (The first such conference was set up by ECA in collaboration with the Department of Music at the University of Leeds in June 2015).

Artistic Director of the Villa Seligmann, Eliah Sakakushevvon Bismarck, (who had attended the 12<sup>th</sup> ECA European Cantors Convention in Prague) invited the delegates at the Magnified and Sanctified 2 Conference to the Villa Seligmann for the closing session. Here below, Eliah (left) is introducing some of the delegates to the elaborately carved rooms at the Villa.



Keynote speakers Judit Frigyesi of Bar Ilan University, and Mark Kligman of the University of



California LA, led the discussions. Challenging aspects were on what makes a melody Jewish, and on written versus oral tradition. It was wonderful to see the numbers of young scholars who came to present papers on aspects of prayer music in their home countries from Czech Republic, Croatia, Galicia,

**Austria, Greece, France and the USA**. The conference included musically illustrated papers, concerts, dinners and a walking tour of Jewish Hannover. A fuller report will follow.
